1ST Day Arriving

Upon arrival in London, the group will gather at the hotel and rest for the first evening before proceeding with the tour of Britain the next day.

2ND Day

- LondonWindsor
- Bath
- Cardiff

After breakfast, we depart from London. First, we will visit Windsor Castle, the world's longest-running palace, where Elizabeth II lived, and the world's biggest castle. Then we'll travel to Bath, one of the most affluent cities in the United Kingdom.

Bath is a UNESCO World Heritage Site known for its Roman bath modest souvenirs. It has beautiful architecture. After witnessing the little cafés, English bakers, and pubs along the Avon River, we will then depart towards Cardiff, Wales' capital. Arrival in Cardiff following a nice one-hour bus journey. Prior to travelling to our accommodation, we will have a panoramic tour of Cardiff. We will visit the National Museum of Wales, Cardiff Castle, Millennium Stadium, City Hall, Norwegian Church, Wales Millennium Centre and other attractions on our tour.

3ND Day

- Caernarfon
- Conwy Castle
- Liverpool

After breakfast, we depart from our accommodation and travel through the oldest cities of North Wales on the west coast of Britain, including Caernarfon, which is notable for its mediaeval castle patterned after the city walls of Istanbul and is also where the Welsh princes are traditionally coronated. Following that, there will be a picture stop at Conwy Castle, which was erected by King Edward I after he invaded Wales in the 13th century. We will begin our panoramic city tour by introducing Liverpool, one of Britain's most significant port towns. This is the most major industrial and commercial city in England. Simultaneously, the "Beatles" community, which emerged from here in the 1960s, introduced Liverpool to the world, and with the city's unique architectural examples and rich exhibitions and museums, it was added to the UNESCO World Heritage List in 2004 and designated as the European Capital of Culture in 2008. Liverpool is well-known around the world for the success of the city's football team. Following our visit to the Metropolitan and Anglican cathedrals, we will see the historical structures in Albert Dock that are protected by the state in the first degree. 4TH Day

After breakfast, we go to Scotland via the famed Lake District. We will enjoy a relaxing boat ride around the famed Lake District, which includes the deepest lake in England, "Wastwater" and England's highest mountain, "Scafell Pike". Following that, we'll visit picturesque places like Ambleside and Grasmere. This natural park offers breathtaking views of the mountains around Lake Windermere, as well as beaches and hundreds of lakes, the longest of which is 15 kilometres in length. We will then arrive at our accommodation, a hotel, in Glasgow or Edinburgh.

We do our Glasgow city tour around the famous George square and shop. Then drive to Edinburgh. We will make our tour introducing Edinburgh, which is on the UNESCO World Cultural Heritage List. Princess Street, Royal Mile, Edinburgh Castle, Holyrood Palace and St. Giles Cathedral are among the places we will see. After the tour, visit Edinburgh Castle, which is considered the symbol of the city... This magnificent castle, which is visible above Edinburgh, was built on a high basalt rock. The Great Hall, Palace, St. Margaret's Chapel, Military Prison and Governor's Mansion, which was also used as the Scottish Parliament building until 1639, are among the places we will see in Edinburgh Castle. Accommodation at our hotel in Edinburgh or Glasgow.

6[™] Day

- The city is located on the northern bank of the River Tyne and comprises the majority of the Tyneside built-up region. Newcastle is also the largest city in Northeast England. Newcastle sprang up around a Roman hamlet called Pons Aelius[8], which was later named after a fortress erected in 1080 by William the Conqueror's eldest son, Robert Curthose. Newcastle's famous landmarks include the Tyne Bridge, the Swing Bridge, Newcastle Castle, St Thomas' Church, and Grainger Town, which includes Grey's Monument and the Theatre Royal. Accommodation at our New Castle or York hotel.

- York is a dynamic festival city with Roman roots and a Viking history that has something for everyone. York is a city with old walls, trendy independent stores, and dynamic cafés, and a festival for every month of the year. York has thirty world-class museums, the greatest racecourse in the country, and a flourishing cultural scene. Not to mention that the Sunday Times named York the best city to live in the UK. London is one of the world's most popular tourist destinations, with a plethora of well-known tourist attractions. In 2018, the city had 20 million international tourists, making it one of the most visited cities in the world. The London Eye is a massive Ferris wheel built on the banks of the Thames. It stands 135 metres tall and has a 120-metre diameter. The London Aquarium, Big Ben, the Houses of Parliament, Westminster Abbey, and Nelson's Column are all nearby. The Shard, London's tallest building, introduced a public observation deck in 2013. Other significanttourrist sites in London include the Tower of London, Buckingham Palace (which is only available to the public for a few months each summer), Tower Bridge Experience, Madame Tussauds, ZSL London Zoo, London Dungeon, and St Paul's Cathedral.





Scotland's capital is one of Europe's most distinctive and remarkable cities. **Edinburgh** has a unique beauty due to its small and cobblestone alleys known as shuts in Scots. The town is also recognized for its frightening corners, gorgeous buildings and gardens, innumerable intriguing museums that are free to explore, and, most importantly, the city's friendly and open residents. All of the aforementioned factors combine to make this city a favourite among those who have visited it.

Edinburgh is locally referred to as **"Auld Reekie"**, which translates to **"Old Smokey"** in Scots. This is due to the city's previous usage of smoke and chimneys, which created pollution above the city.

In addition to innumerable ghost stories, **Edinburgh** provides visitors and locals with a wide range of activities, including museums, the most of which are free. Tourists may also visit a whiskey distillery and learn how Scotland's national drink is manufactured at **the Scotch Whisky Experience**, as well as study how **the Scottish** people lived throughout **the Middle Ages** at **the People's Story Museum** and explore the development of medicine at **the Surgeon's Hall Museums**.


