TeenEagle 1:

Book: The Wild Robot (2016) UNDP Goal: Life on Land

Film: Matilda: The Musical (2022) **UNDP Goal: Quality Education**

A beautiful tale of a robot needing to learn how to survive, and raise a duckling, on a deserted island. It works in well with our UNDP goal of life on land as it shows how all animals in the ecosystem have to work together to survive, and the impacts that external forces have on their environment.

The 2022 film Matilda the Musical highlights the transformative power of education, aligning closely with the United Nations Development Programme's (UNDP) goal of ensuring inclusive, equitable, and quality education for all.

TeenEagle 2: Book: Out of My Mind (2010)
UNDP Goal: Reduced Inequalities

Film: Akeelah and the Bee (2006) **UNDP Goal: Quality Education**

This story powerfully challenges stereotypes and discrimination against people with disabilities, advocating for equal rights, accessibility, and inclusion—all key aspects of the Reduced Inequalities goal.

The 2006 film Akeelah and the Bee showcases the importance of quality education and the power of perseverance, aligning with the UNDP's goal of achieving inclusive, equitable, and quality education for all.

This novel emphasizes personal growth, resilience, and the value of learning through experience. Peak's journey reflects character education, moral decision-making, and self-discovery, all of which are part of holistic education beyond the classroom.

The Pursuit of Happyness offers a powerful narrative that aligns with the UNDP's goal of eradicating poverty by highlighting the transformative potential of opportunity, resilience, and access to education and employment.







WHO ARE WE?

Teen Eagle is an international English Language Competition for students aged 8-18 which consists of two rounds: **Teen Eagle Qualifiers and the Global Finals.**

OUR MISSION

We are enthusiastic about youth altering and influencing the world to make it a better place for all individuals, regardless of ethnicity. As a result, we provide our diverse participants with the opportunity to gain new experiences, demonstrate their knowledge and talents, and assess and evaluate themselves. This is why TeenEagle exists: to as well serve as a worldwide platform to pass on these concepts from generation to generation, as an opportunity for them to exhibit their potential, develop confidence, and take a step toward achieving their future aspirations.



Our English language competition encourages the formation of a shared sense of identity and integration, but we also devote significant effort to fostering diversity and innovative thinking. Through friendly competition, we hope to create healthy, one-of-a-kind, and multinational connections. Cooperation inspires young minds and allows them to exchange ideas, promote peace, and give back to their communities. We are incredibly passionate about forming relationships, which is why we strive to be what educators and students require in order to build a successful future. Not only do we want our students to have a head start on future international academic prospects, but we also want them to develop the ability to convey their academic knowledge.







HOW DOES IT WORK?

The TeenEagle competition requires an **ONLINE registration**. Students can qualify for the Global Finals in one of three ways:

- * **An Online Qualifier Round** Held on the 1st and 3rd Saturdays of every Monday from October to the end of May.
- * A Local Paper-Based Round held by a partner in any country, on the dates they select
- * A Regional Round Event a daily/ multi-day event held in your local country Participants must pass one of the above qualifier events in order to be able to attend the Global Finals.



TeenEagle events are all conducted in English and based on the resources for that TeenEagle level.

- Online and Paper-Based qualifiers are multiple-choice, T/F and fill-in-the-blank style examinations, based on one's knowledge of the given resources (the book and film). These exams have 80 questions in 60 minutes. Gold medal certificate winners are given 10% off for Global Finals.
- Super Online Rounds are held twice a year, and offer top scorers the chance to win free registration for the Global Finals.
- Local Round events are comprised of three competitive events: Spelling Bee, Knowledge Quiz and the Debate Challenge. Gold Medalists win 10% off their Global Finals registration.





What TeenEagle Offers Teachers, Students and Schools

It's important to us to reach out to our global community of Eagles, and ensure that everyone has access to our practice materials and programmes.

TeenEagle Zoom Club Classes

Designed to get our Eagles ready to go for the competitive events, our Zoom Club Classes run a 12-week program, with multiple time slots per week. Eagles can choose which one fits their programmes best, and all topics, schedules and links are one click away, in our portal. The classes are totally free!

Boot Camp Classes

In addition to our zoom club programme, the 4 weeks prior to any Global Final sees a Boot Camp programme. This is only offered to students enrolled in our Global Finals event. It's free, has multiple time slots per week, and is aimed at reviewing everything in the competitive events, and details about our resources that Eagles need to know.

TeenEagle Clubs

Teachers and schools may wish to set up their own TeenEagle clubs, and we are here to help! We've created materials, lesson plans, activities and more to get you started.

How to Set Up a Club?

Step1: Use our Presentation Video on our website to help get school administrators and parents interested in TeenEagle, and aware of the benefits..

Step 2: Decide which type of club best suits your needs and the needs of the parents in your community:

- 1. An in-school club
- 2. After-school activity club
- 3. Weekend extra club
- 4. School-Break Club
- **Step 3:** Use our TeenEagle for Students presentation on our website to get students into it!
- **Step 4:** Download our Teacher Pack and get the resource materials. Use these to set up your club classes and determine what/how to teach your students.
- **Step 5:** Once you've gotten into it and students have studied the resources and learned the materials, have your students take one of our Online Rounds to qualify for the Global Finals!

All of our courses, lesson plans and materials are aligned with chosen UNDP Sustainable Development Goals. We do this not only to get important messages to our global Eagles, but also to give them the opportunity to discuss, consider and take action on some big world issues. We want our Eagles to know that they can make a big IMPACT no matter who they are or where they are in the world.








SELECTION CRITERIA FOR THE GLOBAL FINALS

All participants must register and pass through at least one qualifier round.

A total score of 40% or equivalent or more must be achieved in order to qualify for the Global Finals.

All participants must familiarise themselves with the terms and conditions and agree upon registration.

*Supervisors and parents must also register to accompany the students.

DESCRIPTION

Participants complete in an online quiz based on the given resources.

Participants write about the chosen topic individually.

Each participant is asked to spell words from their resources, as seen on the Spelling Bee word list.

An Oxford Union style, three-on-three team debate on a given topic.

A team-based, interactive project based on the main theme of the book resource.

- All participants will receive a certificate of participation and a certificate of achievement, as well as gold, silver and bronze and honourable mention medals based on their performance in the above mentioned categories.
- All participants will receive a 10% discount at our partner summer schools in the UK.







Interactive IMPACT Project

TeenEagle's Interactive IMPACT Project competitive event aims to truly test the understanding of our resources and the ability to present one's ideas. Judged by a panel based on our Project Rubric, this event accounts for 20% of the overall score in the Global Finals events of TeenEagle.

How it works:

The goal is to take the main theme of the BOOK resource for your TeenEagle age category and create a project that shows its importance and value, and make an IMPACT on your judges and peers.

These projects are:


Interactive • Team-based • Theme-based • Briefed • Built/Created • Presented • Judged

Projects can be anything, but please see the following samples for some ideas to help the creativity flow! Let's say our book's main theme was combating global warming. You could choose to do a project like these outlined below:

An original song to make listeners hear and **FEEL** your point, performed live

A PSA Video showing Earth's future if pollution continues unchecked A mobile or terrarium showing the greenhouse effect in action An art piece depicting the horrors of a future destroyed by climate change An interactive carbon footprint calculator, operated by users based on their actions

No matter what you decide, the way you present and explain your project is most vital. It's your task to make your audience hear you, understand you and be impacted by your project.


