LONDON

Well-known tourist attractions include the London Eye, Piccadilly Circus, Tower Bridge, and Trafalgar Square. Last but not least, London is home to many great museums, galleries, libraries, and cultural venues, such as the British Museum, National Gallery, Tate Modern, and West End theatres.

Cambridge is a university city in the county town of Cambridgeshire, England. It is located on the River Cam, about 90 kilometres north of London. During the Roman and Viking ages, Cambridge became an important trading centre. Today, it is infamous for the University of Cambridge, founded in 1209 and consistently ranking at the top of the list for universities in the world.

Oxford is a city in England, in the country town of Oxfordshire. It is about 90 kilometres north of London and is home to the University of Oxford, the oldest university in the English-speaking world. It is one of the most culturally diverse cities in the UK, with a vibrant and cosmopolitan population.
