Kuala Lumpur is the capital and largest city of Malaysia, a country located in the heart of Southeast Asia. The cityscape is filled with both gleaming skyscrapers and colonial architecture. Kuala Lumpur is also widely recognised for numerous landmarks, including Petronas Twin Towers, the Petaling Street flea market, and Batu Caves, that are over 400 million years old.

Malaysia is the world's largest producer of oil palm. Once upon a time, the ancient states of Ligor, Langkasuka and Takkada were located on the territory of Malaysia. The history of Kuala Lumpur begins in 1857, when 87 Chinese miners headed up the Klang River in search of tin. Kuala Lumpur received the status of a federal territory precisely because of its pronounced ethnic and religious diversity.



BATU CAVES AND GENTING HIGHLANDS THEME PARK TRIP



The limestone forming **Batu Caves** is said to be around 400 million years old. Some of the cave entrances were used as shelters by the indigenous Temuan / Besisi people (a tribe of Orang Asli). As early as 1860, Chinese settlers began excavating guano for fertilising their vegetable patches. However, they became famous only after the limestone hills were recorded by colonial authorities including Daly and Syers as well as American Naturalist William Hornaday in 1878.




MULTIMEDIA UNIVERSITY, SILICON VALLEY AND SHAH ALAM MOSQUE

Multimedia University (MMU) is a private research university based in **Malacca.** The university received university status in 1996, making it the oldest private university in the country. The focus of education at the university is on information technology and multimedia.



Malacca is the capital of the Malay state of the same nam. It is located on both sides of the **Malacca River** at its confluence with the **Malay Passage.** The old town of Malacca, together with the old town of George Town (Penang), was inscribed on the UNESCO list of **World Heritage Sites** in Asia in 2008 as the historic cities of the Malay Passage that were a place of cultural exchange between the West and the East for some 500 years, as evidenced by their tangible and intangible multicultural heritage.

The city and **Kingdom of Malacca** was founded in the late 14th and early 15th century. The small fishing village quickly became a major port and trading center that overshadowed the older ports in the area. With the support of the Chinese emperor, the king of Malacca managed to remain independent from Siam.
