LONDON




London is the capital and largest city of England and the **United Kingdom** and the centre of the **Greater London** region. London has been a city for two millennia, since it was founded by the Romans under the name **Londinium** in the middle of the first century AD. The old core of London, the City of London, has largely retained its mediaeval boundaries. Since the 17th century, the name London also refers to the metropolis that developed around the old core. Most of this conurbation makes up the London region and the **Greater London** administrative area, which is governed by the Mayor of London and the London Assembly.

London is a significant global city and one of the world's largest financial centres with the largest gross domestic product in **Europe.**



CAMBRIDGE • OXFORD



Cambridge is a university city and the county town in **Cambridgeshire.** The city is most famous as the home of the **University of Cambridge**, which was founded in 1209 and consistently ranks among the top universities in the world. It is the home of the famous **Cavendish Laboratory**, **King College Chapel** and the **University Library**.

The latter two dominate the **Cambridge** skyline, along with the chimney of Addenbrooke's Hospital seen from the south side of the city, while from the north it is the tower of **St. John's College.**

Oxford is a city in England, in the country town of Oxfordshire. It is about 90 kilometres north of London and is home to the University of Oxford, the oldest university in the English-speaking world. It is also known for its range of architectures, boasting buildings in every imaginable style starting from the late Anglo-Saxon period. It is one of the most culturally diverse cities in the UK, with a vibrant and cosmopolitan population.
