





- \* The state is home to many iconic landmarks, such as the **Statue of Liberty**, , Central Park, Empire State Building, and Niagara Falls.






The Statue of Liberty is a colossal neoclassical sculpture on Liberty Island in New York Harbor in New York City, in the United States. It is widely known as **the most iconic structure in the** world. The statue became an icon of freedom and of the United States, being subsequently seen as a symbol of welcome to immigrants arriving by sea.



**Designed by Frederick Law Olmsted and Calvert Vaux,** Central Park influenced the development of urban parks nationwide and is widely regarded as a masterpiece of landscape architecture. **It has eight lakes and ponds that were created artificially** by damming natural seeps and flows. Central Park is full of attractions, from green meadows to sprawling waters, **gardens and unique bridges,** music and performance centers, educational facilities, classical architecture and more. Its picturesque beauty boasts natural green landscapes and vistas as far as the eye can see.



**Times Square** is the liveliest part of Manhattan. It is a must visit when you are in New York City. 


## **SIX FLAGS**
